Claire's head band. 's means this person owns something not there are two Claires.

Ross' pencil. Careful if the name ends in an s the apostrophe goes after it.

The dogs' bowls. This sentence suggests there is more than one dog who owns the bowl.

Exception

Its and it's are the exception to the rule.

Its hand was hairy. The hand belongs to it (whatever it is) no apostrophe for possession.

It's very cold today. The apostrophe is used for the contraction it is.
